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BURGUNDY VINTAGE REPORT 2023

“A rare vintage offering a combination of quality and quantity...”



Multiple vintages have been testing Burgundy’s nerve for some years now, with annual volumes so variable and weather patterns so unpredictable that the region’s resilience never ceases to impress. Yet with all the climatic challenges Burgundy faces, it remains steadfast in maintaining its goal of delivering wines so attractively lively, fine and complex, revealing so many distinctive facets of terroir, that we continue to be captivated as we discover the many more fine examples that appear year on year.

In 2023, frost was thankfully avoided by most vineyards, but the weather was far from clement, with a mix of cold, and at times wet, periods followed by heat spikes just before and at the start of the harvest. These warm conditions resulted in a selective vintage, and though the yield potentials were quite large, 2023 still delivered many beautiful reds, often very ripe and with lovely soft tannins and attractive concentration. Some producers sacrificed volumes strategically by using bunch thinning (‘green harvest’) to encourage concentration and help attain ideal phenolic ripeness; others increased their whole cluster (full bunch) vinification to retain freshness while adding tension to their wines.

The whites were also challenged by the very warm periods preceding and during the first days of harvest. With acidity capable of falling rapidly under such conditions, vigneron were kept sharply on their toes to retain freshness and balance in their wines. Strangely, it wasn’t always the earlier picked grapes that produced the freshest of wines. Waiting for full maturity was also successful, as acidity intensified along with the sugars and helped to define the final balance in many wines.

The weather conditions have once again proved that there’s no single set method in Burgundy, with each producer finding their own way to read and act on a challenging vintage. Generally, the 2023 wines are true to provenance, but the final style is vastly different from one producer to the next. Many reds will be very pleasant in their youth with very ripe fruit but few will have the intensity and structure to keep for a very long time, although history shows us that warm vintages often have surprisingly good ageing potential. It’s the same for the whites, with producers used to making leaner, more taut wines turning to riper examples. These slightly more austere wines will be more approachable in their youth.

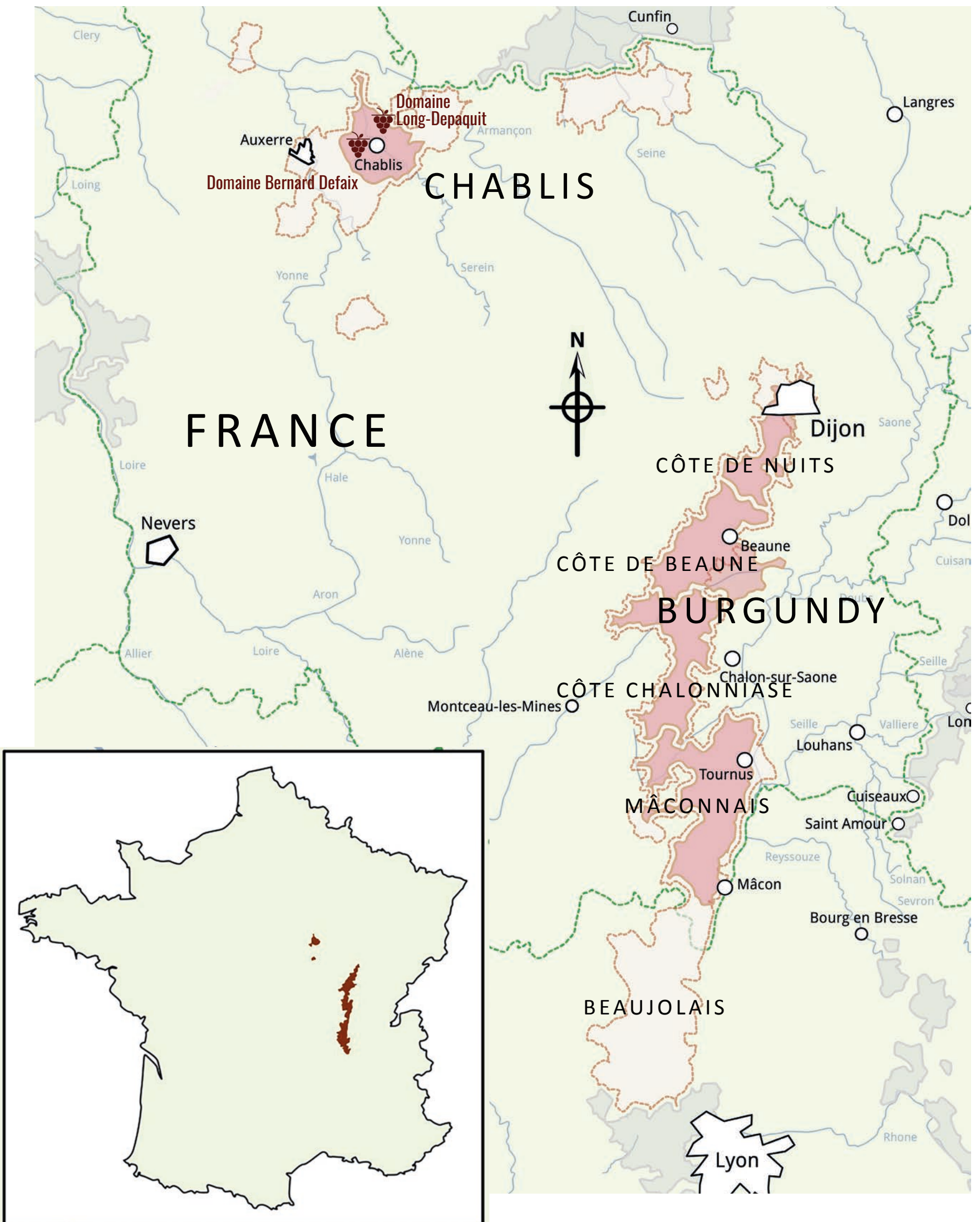
Depending on the appellation and who you speak to, some producers compared the 2023 vintage wines to 2017 or 2018, with some as far back as 2009 and 1999, but we believe that this vintage is very often superior and will procure a lot of pleasure early and mid-term. Prices for 2023 are more or less in line with the 2022 vintage.

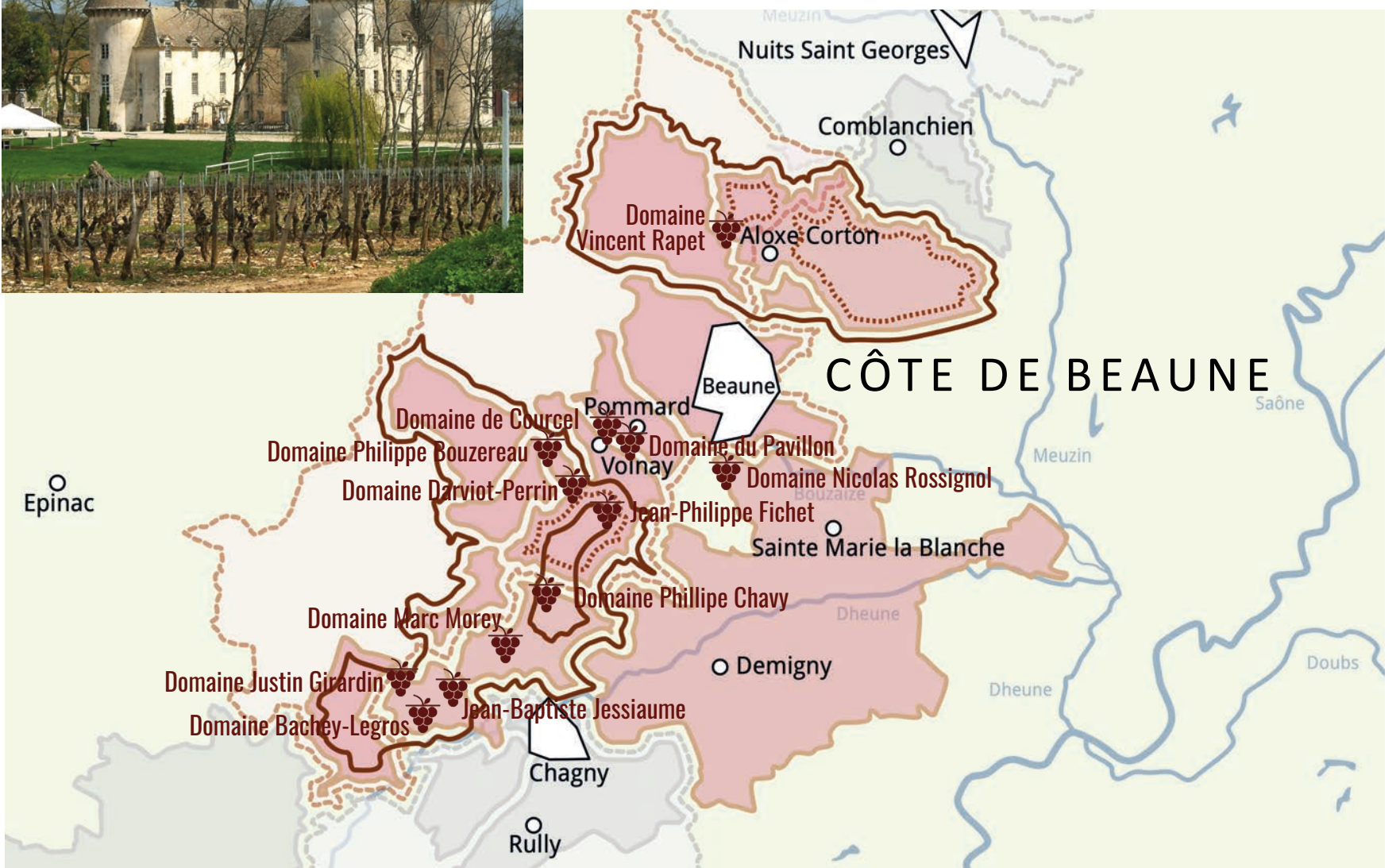
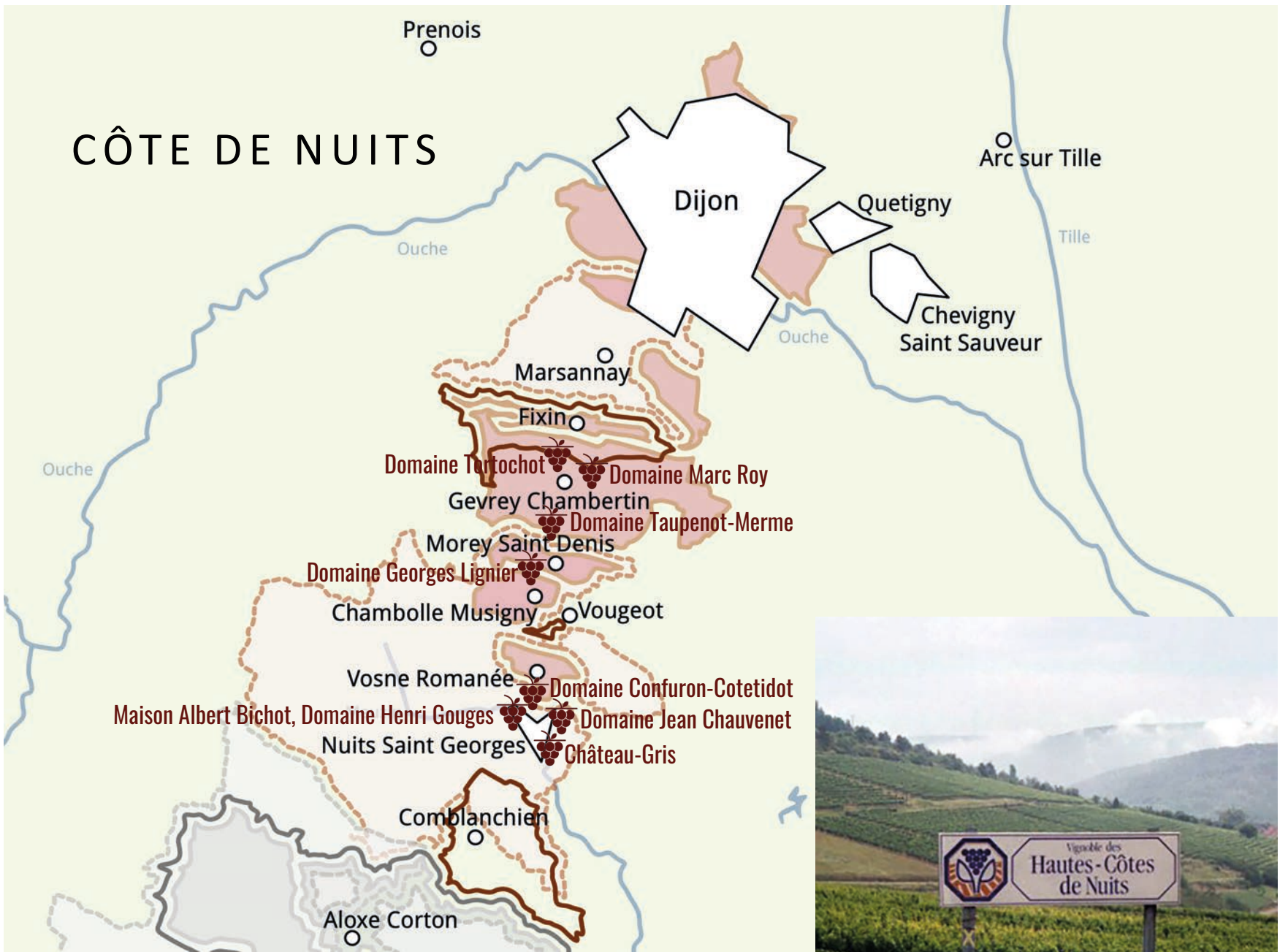
Note: without pre-judging the quality of the 2024 vintage, it’s worth considering when buying 2023 EP that the 2024 vintage has been among the most challenging of the past 30 years. Quantities are likely to be extremely low (even lower than the 2021 vintage), which in turn will place severe limitations on the accessibility of 2024 EP wines.

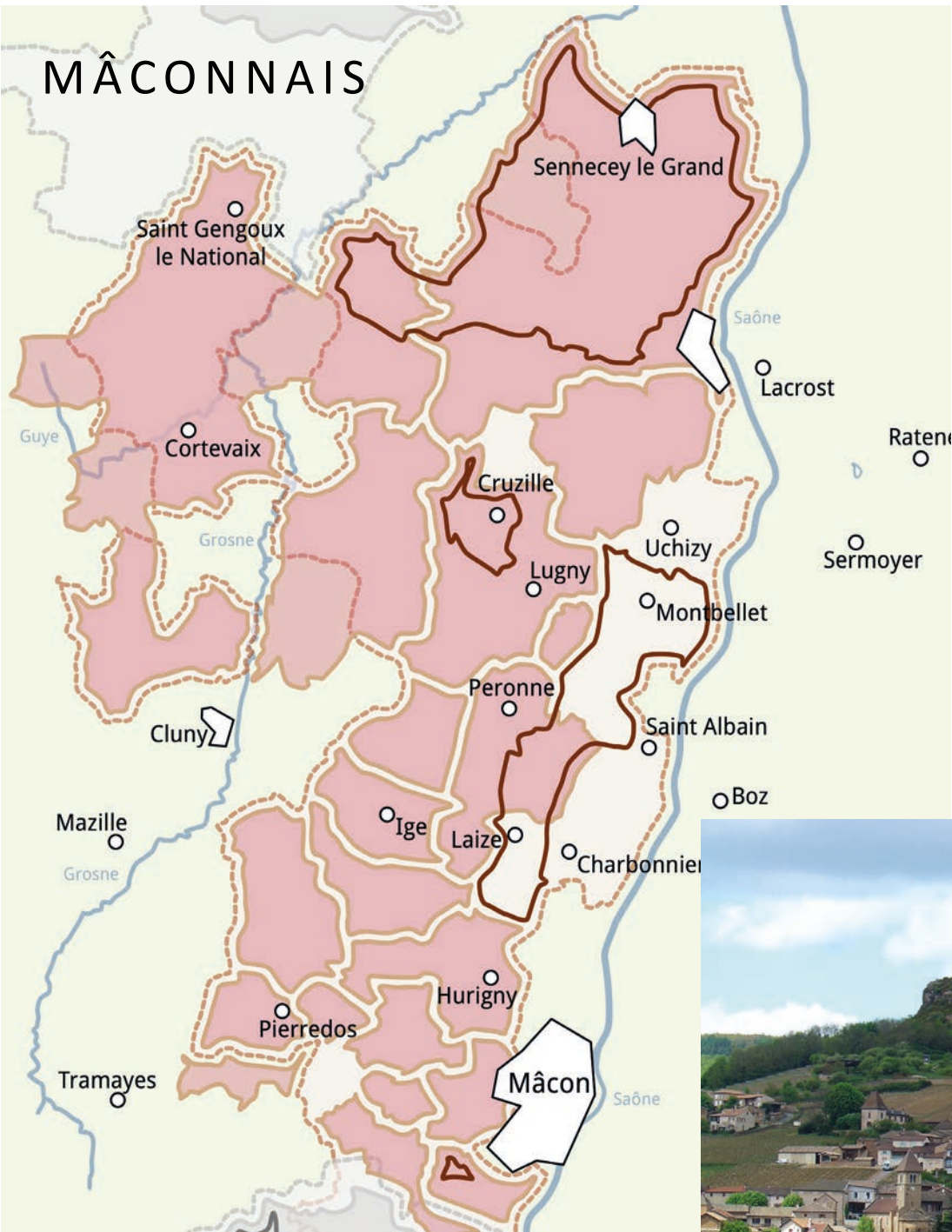
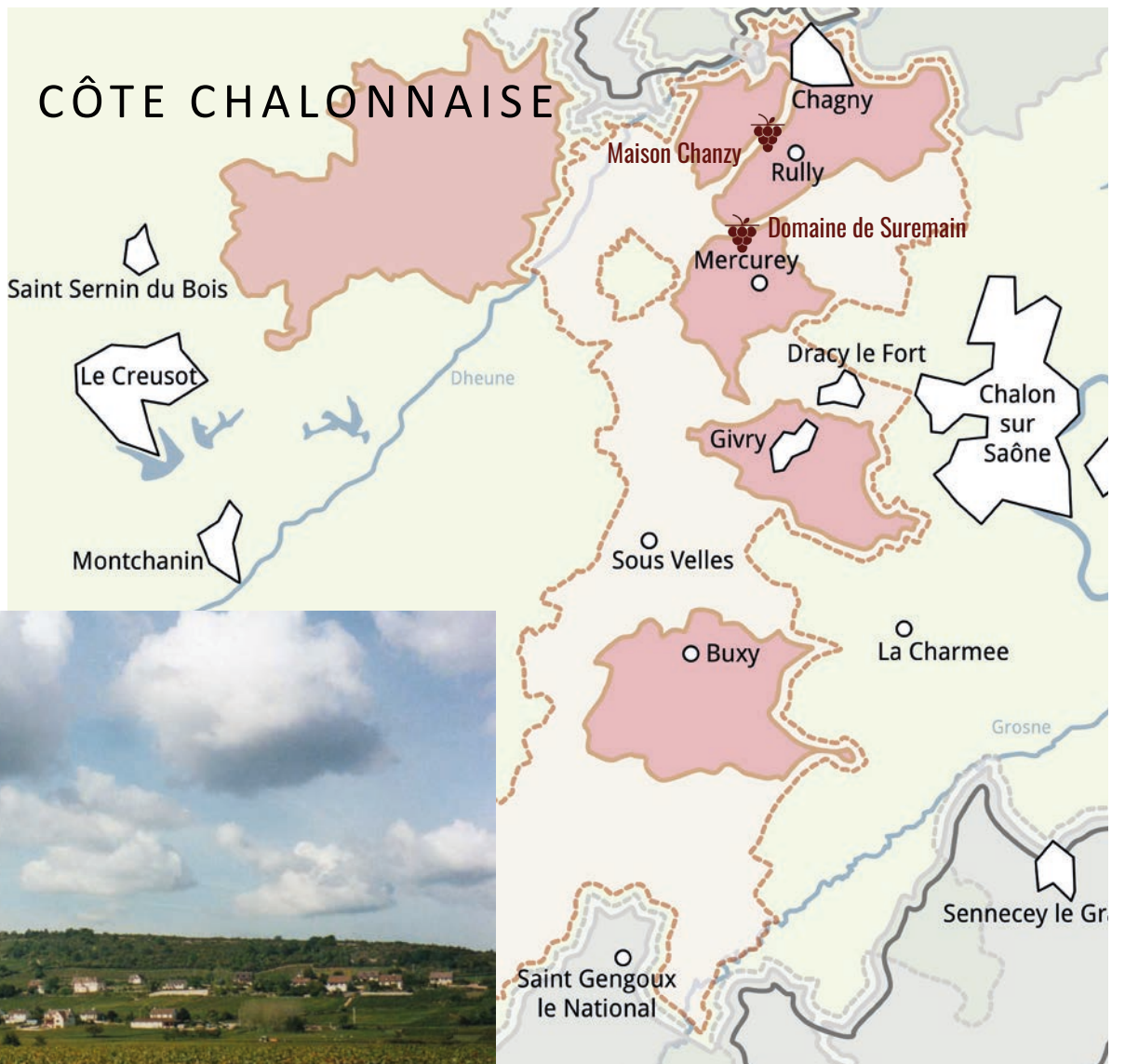

BURGUNDY PRODUCER GUIDE

The Burgundy region consists of three quite separate areas – Chablis to the northwest, core Burgundy and Beaujolais to the south. Burgundy core itself is divided into four sub-regions: Côte de Nuits, Côte de Beaune, Côte Chalonnaise and Mâconnais.







NOTES & KEY TO LISTINGS

- All case prices stated are £ In Bond (London City Bond Tilbury) per case of 6 bottles (6 x 75 cl) unless otherwise stated. Duty Tax + VAT will be charged at the rates in force at the time of DPD delivery (LCB delivery/UB transfer surcharges tbc).
- All wines are from the 2023 vintage unless otherwise stated. Wines that are already bottled are labelled **(b)**.
- Producers Certified Organic are labelled (O) and Certified Biodynamic (B). Producers labelled (N) are new to H2VIN customers.
- For all orders of £500.00 In Bond or more at En Primeur Offer price(s), delivery Duty Paid (i.e. after Duty Tax and VAT settlement) or Under Bond Transfer will be free of charge per individual stock delivery/transfer of £500.00 In Bond or more within England. Separate quotes can be given for deliveries to Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland. For orders of less than £500.00 In Bond, including per individual stock delivery/transfer at values less than £500.00 In Bond, please refer to the Terms & Conditions on page 35 of this booklet.
- The letter **E** before a price denotes that the price is estimated and awaits final price confirmation from the producer (*tbc* early 2025).
- Cases cannot be split. Each producer will decide on final case size at the time of bottling/release, so some wines may come in 2 x cases (6 x 75cl) or 1 x case (12 x 75cl), or 1 x case (3 x 75cl) unless stated otherwise.
- Original cases are only guaranteed for confirmed allocations with full case purchases.
- Wines will be shipped between March and November 2025 at the individual producer's discretion based on bottling dates.

Important Note Legislation introduced by GOV.UK on post-Brexit importation documentation (EX1 & C88 docs – HMRC/GB Customs & Excise imposed) continues to add significant increased costs when importing goods 'Per Estate' to the UK from the EU with GB documentation lagging behind. As a result, some cuvées that would have been ready for shipping earlier may well be shipped later alongside longer elevage cuvées to help keep costs and freight surcharges down.

NB GOV.UK abolished the simpler pre-Brexit EU freight forwarding documentation processes, which saved costs when freight-forwarding multiple estate(s) logged together within same shipping container/parcel documents. It is now notably more costly for UK Importers and UK Consumers wishing to consolidate multiple shipments from the same wine region, with ongoing incremental freight forwarding costs increasing each year.

CHABLIS

Domaine Bernard Defaix, Chablis (N)

Situated a little north of the eponymous village of Chablis, brothers Didier and Sylvain have some of the best situated vineyards in the region, and are known for their efforts to coax the best from the soils. Their wines are powerful, textural and capable of considerable development. Certified Organic since 2009 and with biodynamic influences, they are flagship examples of why Chablis is so special. Combining elements of biodynamic practices with more traditional techniques, the alcoholic and malolactic fermentations are carried out in stainless steel tanks or oak barrels according to the cuvées using natural yeasts. The wines then rest on fine lees for 8 to 12 months depending on the characteristics of each vintage and cru. No sulphur or fining are applied; just a light filtration immediately prior to bottling.

Domaine Long-Depaquit, Chablis

Founded in 1791, Domaine Long-Depaquit is one of the most renowned estates in Chablis and is now owned by the family-run Burgundy House of Albert Bichot. The striking château is located at the heart of the town itself, and it is here that the fruit from the surrounding 65ha of vineyards is vinified. Restricted yields and non-interventionist winemaking add to the quality. Grapes for the Grand Crus (9ha, or 9% of the total Grand Cru vineyard area), Premier Crus (15 ha) and Chablis Village appellations are cultivated in an environmentally responsible way, with composting and ploughing replacing the use of fertilisers and herbicides. The Estate obtained Level 3 HEV (High Environmental Value) certification in 2019.

Domaine Moreau-Naudet

The hugely sad and shocking death of the young, highly talented Stéphane Moreau in 2016 robbed the winemaking world of an undoubted star. Since then, his wife Virginie and the team have been carrying on his brilliant work. With 13.5ha under vine, including a tiny 1 hectare parcel in 'Les Pargues' planted with 50-year-old vines that benefit from the same exposure as 'Vaillons' and 'Montmains', the domaine includes some excellent holdings. The style of the wines reminds us of Vincent Dauvissat's – slightly richer, but with extreme purity and intensity. One of Stéphane's mentors was Didier Dagueneau, and this also shows itself in the Moreau-Naudet style – notably in the precise, razor-sharp flavours of the wines and in the quirkiness of some of the packaging.

MÂCONNAIS

Domaine Cordier

Christophe Cordier is a multi-talented winemaker. After establishing the 25ha family domaine as the leader in the region, he also started a small négociant range, buying the best grapes sourced locally from some of the finest, oldest and most trusted vineyards in Mâconnais. Christophe manages almost 30ha in total, covering almost 100 different plots in eight villages. All the vineyards employ both sustainable and organic farming practices, with harvests carried out by hand. Christophe prefers to employ traditional winemaking techniques allied to the best of modern technology, crafting classically elegant wines in his purpose-built, state-of-the-art winery.

Domaine Sébastien Giroux (O)

Domaine Sébastien Giroux is an up-and-coming and relatively new wine producer in the Mâconnais, with 7ha of vines in and around Fuissé that have been in the hands of the Giroux family for almost three centuries. Sébastien succeeded his father as manager of the domaine in 2009, since then he has made a number of changes – notably that the winery now works 100% organically and uses miniscule amounts of additives in the winemaking process.

CÔTE CHALONNAISE

Maison Chanzy (N)

Maison Chanzy is a highly respected Burgundian producer, whose wines are classic expressions of its premium vineyards in Côte Chalonnaise, Côte de Beaune and Côte de Nuits. The present Chanzy range has been crafted by winemaker Max Blondelle, whose aim is to create wines that eloquently communicate their respective terroirs while maintaining a hands-off approach to winemaking. Chanzy are sustainable farmers, adapting their practices to the prevailing climate and to the specific characteristics of each site. They have achieved the most highly regarded sustainable certification in France, HTV (*Haute Valeur Environnementale*) Level 3, which is awarded for proficiency in four key areas: biodiversity conservation, plant protection strategy, management of fertiliser use and management of water. In the cellar, the temperature of fermentation is carefully controlled in stainless steel vats to ensure freshness and all the wines undergo malolactic fermentation. Chanzy adapt their ageing techniques to the needs of each appellation and vineyard, working with French oak barrels from up to eight different cooperages and varying barrel sizes to enhance complexity.

Domaine Jaeger Defaix (N)

Hélène Jaeger-Defaix took over her first vineyard in Rully, the 1^{er} Cru Mont-Palais, from her great-aunt, Henriette Niepce, in October 2002. She now runs the estate with the same organic cultivation philosophy as that of her husband's Chablis domaine, Domaine Bernard Defaix. The family has a long history in the region, with Henri Niepce, Hélène's great-grandfather, contributing significantly to Rully's award of AOC status in the 1930s and subsequent rise to fame. In November 2003, Hélène took over a second plot on Rully 1^{er} Cru Préaux. Farmed organically since 2009, the vines average 35 years in age and are hand-picked. Pressing is slow and gentle to extract the best juice, and handling is kept to a minimum to preserve the elegance of the wine.

Domaine de Suremain

Domaine de Suremain comprises 18ha of vines spread across some of Mercurey's finest appellations. The property has been in the same family for seven generations and is currently run by Yves Suremain, his wife Marie-Hélène and their son Loïc. The vineyards are situated on high slopes and mid-slopes, facing to the south and east in the heart of the appellation. These holdings include no less than six different red Mercureys, including five 1^{er} Crus. They also produce one white Mercurey from the 1^{er} Cru 'En Sazenay'. When it comes to vineyard work, the family's philosophy is to respect nature, following a '*lutte raisonnée*' approach that adapts techniques and treatments to the prevailing climatic conditions. The harvest is gathered by hand and packed in small crates before being carefully sorted on '*une table de tri*'. Fermentation is carried out in open oak *cuves* of 50-100hl cru by cru, and sensitively judged *égrappage* and *pigeage* are applied depending on the cru and the vintage. The wines are then matured in French oak barriques (10-15% new) for 14-18 months.

CÔTE DE BEAUNE

Domaine Bachey-Legros

The quality and style of Bachey-Legros' wines are deeply intertwined with the history of the family, which spans six generations. Today, a new chapter in that history is being written thanks to the passion of brothers Lénaïc and Samuel Legros, who diligently tend 18ha of prime holdings boasting an array of old Pinot Noir and Chardonnay vines planted between 1935 and 1955 on some of the best sites in Santenay, Chassagne-Montrachet and Les Maranges. These low-yielding vines, with their deeply anchored roots and concentrated fruit, provide the foundation for top-quality wines that exhibit power and elegance in equal measure as well as a strong regional identity. The whites are gently pressed, then fermented at low temperatures before being transferred to barrel on the lees for 12-15 months, with *bâtonnage* performed regularly until the onset of malolactic fermentation. The reds are naturally powerful, with a vinification style in which gentle handling and extraction are *de rigueur*, favouring roundness and purity of fruit.

Domaine Justin Girardin

Having joined his father Jacques and mother Valérie at the family domaine, talented young winemaker Justin Girardin is continuing a family winemaking legacy that dates back to the early 10th century. With prime parcels of vines spread across Santenay totalling 17ha, Justin practices traditional Burgundian techniques to produce deeply concentrated wines with superb balance and rich fruit character. The philosophy here is to let nature express itself fully, and to observe and respect the different terroirs. His work in the cellar is similarly careful and respectful. Using natural yeasts, gentle extraction and only a very light filtration at bottling, he allows his wines to exhibit their true personalities. Justin has used more lees in his red winemaking again this year, as he feels it helps to lend an extra roundness to the tannins.

Jean-Baptiste Jessiaume (N)

With vineyards in various appellations, including Pommard, Saint-Aubin, Beaune, Saint-Romain, and Bourgogne Hautes-Côtes de Beaune, the Jessiaume estate comprises a total of 12.5ha and is characterised by its diverse terroirs. The slopes range from gentle inclines to steeper hillsides, with varying altitudes and exposures, while the soil profiles include limestone, clay-limestone and marl, each of which contribute unique characteristics to the wines. The vines are primarily Pinot Noir and Chardonnay, most of which are mature and well-established, and are typically trained on the traditional Guyot or Cordon systems. The result is a range of cuvées, each reflecting the uniqueness of their terroir, but united in their elegance, complexity, and ability to age gracefully. A passionate advocate for sustainable winemaking practices, the Jessiaume estate minimises the use of chemical inputs, promotes biodiversity, and employs organic or biodynamic farming methods wherever possible. The winemaking process is also low-intervention, allowing the natural character of the grapes to shine through. Harvesting is a meticulous process, with the fruit hand-picked at optimal ripeness. The grapes are then gently pressed, and the resulting juice is fermented in oak barrels. The wines then undergo a period of lees aging, allowing them to develop complexity and texture, although the actual process varies depends on the wine and the desired style. Those offered here showcase the exceptional quality and diversity of styles to be found in the region. Jean Baptiste Jessiaume's talent and dedication have been widely recognised within the industry. In 2012, his exceptional winemaking skills were acknowledged in the award of the prestigious Young Talent trophy by renowned wine critic Allen Meadows – a significant career milestone that solidified his reputation as a rising star in the world of winemaking.

Domaine Bruno Colin (N)

Following his training at Beaune's Viticultural School, Bruno started working with his parents and brother in 1993 at the family's Domaine Michel Colin-Deleger. In 2003, the mutual decision was taken to divide the family domaine into three separate entities – Domaine Michel Colin-Deleger, Domaine Philippe Colin and Domaine Bruno Colin – and Bruno produced his first vintage in 2004. With 8.75ha currently under vine in Chassagne, Puligny, Saint Aubin, Santenay and Dézize-lès-Maranges, spanning 22 appellations that include eight 1^{er} Cru whites in Chassagne alone, Bruno strives to produce wines that are taught and precise, offering a pure expression of their terroir. Sustainable methods are in place to protect vineyards, yields are strictly controlled and wines are vinified in the same way to reflect the differences between various parcels. The wines are aged for 12 months in French oak barrels, 25% of which are new, then raked and blended in stainless steel vats for 3 to 6 months prior to bottling. The resulting wines are frank, with great aromatic purity and remarkable balance, their astute minerality and liveliness supporting their richness.

Her wines are energised, super refined, layered and textural with great precision.

The talented Thomas Morey, younger son of Bernard, has set up his cellar in the old family house in Chassagne-Montrachet. Diligent, serious and a hardworking perfectionist, he has renovated the winery into a very clean and organised operation. He works his 9ha diligently and skilfully, having already established himself as one of the stars of the appellation. His style is different from that of his father, proving to be tauter and more linear with greater initial restraint – closer to the modern idiom of fine White Burgundy.

The quietly spoken, charming Jean-Marc Blain, married to Claudine (daughter of the late Jacques Gagnard), fashions Chassagne crus of delicacy and finesse. They are pure terroir, savoury lined and precise wines which seduce the palate with their elegance and subtlety rather than their weight and richness. There’s an aura of patience enforced here: the cerebral, almost Chablis-esque wines command a degree of consideration when enjoying. With Jean-Marc nearing retirement, he is gradually handing over parcels to his son, Marc-Antoine, so keep a sharp eye out for new wines to come.

Domaine Phillippe Chavy (N)

Third-generation Philippe Chavy took over the reins of this wealthy domaine from his father in 2002 with little more than 3ha of prime-sited vineyards. The domaine now extends to just over 8ha, with some 30 individual parcels scattered throughout the neighbouring villages of Puligny Montrachet (from his father’s side of the family) and Meursault (through his maternal side). The soil is worked by ploughing, there is strictly no use of herbicides or insecticides, and for several years Philippe has followed the cycles of the lunar calendar when determining work in the vineyards and cellars.

Domaine Hubert Lamy (N)

With vineyards dating back to 1640, Olivier Lamy's father, Hubert, made extensive expansions throughout the 1990s, in the process accumulating an impressive array of vineyards across St-Aubin, Chassagne-Montrachet, Puligny-Montrachet and Santenay. Today, Olivier stands tall as one of the leading winemakers of his generation, his 18.5ha producing incredibly precise and finely chiselled wines that age impeccably well and are among most sought-after in the Côte de Beaune. Driven by a desire to make the best wines possible, Olivier has successfully implemented many changes in both the vineyards and the winery, replanting at high density with a fully organic approach, adding a mix of fermentation and ageing vessels, and paying painstaking attention to detail in the cellars. The fine quality of the wines has dramatically enhanced the standing of Saint Aubin, where is now mentioned in the same breath as the more celebrated neighbouring appellations of Chassagne-Montrachet and Puligny-Montrachet. The wines' signature racy style, with great acidity and length to the fore, always punch above their weight and will age well due to their fine balance. The reds offer deep, ripe yet well-manicured tannins along with a bright, fresh red-fruit character.

Olivier Leflaive

Domaine Olivier Leflaive is one of Burgundy's most recognisable names, with a history that dates back to the early 18th century. However, it wasn't until 1905, when Olivier's grandfather inherited 2ha of prime vineyard and began purchasing others in the wake of the phylloxera epidemic, that the estate began to shape itself into the significant operation that exists today. As a producer and *négociant*, the domaine vinifies 120 ha of prime fruit (including 17 of its own), creating mainly white wines from the three prestigious Côte de Beaune villages of Puligny-Montrachet, Chassagne-Montrachet and Meursault, as well as from Chablis and the Côte Chalonnaise. The daily mission is to produce top-quality grapes. This involves a sustainable approach to working the vines, and also supporting partner winegrowers to cultivate their plots using an organic or biodynamic approach. There is currently no organic certification simply because the domaine does not hesitate to use chemical treatment *in extremis*.

Henri Boillot

Henri Boillot is a benchmark Côte de Beaune producer renowned for the exceptional quality of his wines. Using parcels of vines more than 60 years old, including the domaine’s exclusive and highly sought-after monopole Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru ‘Clos de la Mouchère’, his seriously impressive wines exhibit an intense minerality, elegant structure and have the potential to age for many years. Boillot now uses a maximum of 50% new oak for his 1er crus (and a bit more for his Grand Crus), stressing that because he ages his wines almost exclusively in 350 litre barrels, ‘it’s more like 35%’. The wines are superb, displaying crisp brightness and intensity with great depth of mid-palate complexity, texture and long persistence.

Domaine Philippe Bouzereau (B)

Philippe Bouzereau is the ninth generation of a family of vine-growers in Meursault. Following on from his father he took over the management of this fine 18ha domaine back in 2006, helped by his brother Charles. His team practice minimum intervention to enable the vines to develop naturally and healthily. Philippe’s emblematic wine is the 1.7ha monopole Meursault ‘Vieux Clos du Château de Cîteaux’, produced from a single parcel of vines planted by his father. He also cultivates a diverse selection of vineyard plots, from Aloxe-Corton in the north to Chassagne-Montrachet in the south, supplying a multitude of small parcels with which to assemble what he terms the ‘mosaic’ of his production. Using modest levels of new oak, and refraining from ‘bâtonnage’ completely, he prefers to let the wines’ natural richness and flavour shine through.

Domaine Darviot-Perrin (O) (N)

This 9ha family domain consists of some very fine holdings within Meursault and Chassagne, producing impressive wines with crystalline precision from old vines. Established in 1989 by Dider and wife Geneviève, it is now deservedly counted among the best in Burgundy. Didier Darviot's son Pierre-Antonin returned in 2019 to help run the estate and since then has been learning from his father, who is known as one of the most meticulous and thoughtful winemakers in the region. The vineyards have been farmed organically for 25 years, converting to Biodynamics in 2019 and being Certified Organic in 2023, with a winery certification currently pending. More recently the family has adopted new pruning methods to de-stress the vines. The oak regime comes with a judicious touch: the wines spend 6-7 months in tank and a further 1 year in barrel with with a maximum of 15% new oak, giving an overall ageing period of 18-24 months. The resulting wines display great purity and precision, combined with remarkable staying power.

Domaine Patrick Javillier

As one of Meursault's best growers, it would be difficult to find another winemaker with quite such a perfectionist personality as the ever-thoughtful, precisely spoken Patrick Javillier. Patrick runs his 9ha family-owned domaine with discreet diligence, but it is increasingly his daughter Marion, now taking the leading role, who sensitively orchestrates the renowned delicacy and refinement of the wines found here. Great believers that long *élevage* on lees is essential for ageworthy wines in the bottle, father and daughter vinify parcel by parcel and cask by cask before making their final *assemblages*. A deft touch of new oak on certain cuvées only adds to the cautious and sensitive approach, with most of the wines taken out of barrel after a year, then further matured further in tank on their fine lees.

Domaine Nicolas Rossignol

Nicolas Rossignol is the fifth generation of his family to make wines in Volnay. Starting out in 1994, he made his first wines on the family estate of Rossignol-Jeanniard. Then, following oenology studies in Beaune, he amassed a wealth of winemaking experience working at Domaine Joseph Voillot, Louis Latour and Domaine de Vieux Télégraphe, along with Boschendal in South Africa (1995) and Château La Cardonne (owned Château Lafite Rothschild). In 1997 he created his own estate with 3ha spread across Volnay, Pommard, Beaune, Aloxe-Corton and Pernand-Vergelesses, and by 1998 had increased his holdings to 16ha. In 2005 the estate took in several new appellations, including Savigny-les-Beaune 1^{er} Crus 'Fourneaux' and 'Lavières' and Beaune 1^{er} Cru 'Clos du Roy'. By 2011 all the wines were labelled 'Domaine Nicolas Rossignol' and spanned 30 different appellations. In 2014 the estate acquired another 1.5ha of Pommard 1^{er} Cru and Pommard, and today covers over 17ha thanks to the addition of Beaune 1^{er} Cru 'Clos des Mouche', Pommard and Monthélie. Since 2017, a new cuverie on the edge of Beaune has given Nicolas the wherewithal to vinify each cru by terroir and by parcel. Both in the vineyard and the cellars he works according to the lunar calendar and practices organic and Biodynamic methods. However, he is currently not certified, as he considers the risk of abandoning intervention altogether to be too great. The 2023 vintage has been a great success qualitatively, with many wines showing their pedigree and fine *typicité*, albeit in an elegant, well-structured and opulent way.

Domaine de Courcel

Created at the beginning of the 16th century and still family owned and run, this highly regarded 10ha domaine consists of vineyards exclusively in the village of Pommard. Since 1996 the winemaking has been carried out by Yves Confuron (of Domaine Confuron-Cotetidot in Vosne Romanée) and the wines have definitely stepped up a gear thanks to a combination of old vines, great plots, low yields and the restrained use of new oak. The domaine produces wines from seven different plots (*climats*), all in Pommard; four of them, representing close to 75% of the estate's total area, are Premier Cru. 'Le Grand Clos des Epenots' is the *monopole* of the domaine – a 4.89ha plot located north of Pommard at the foot of an east-facing slope. Rugiens (1.07ha) sits midway on the southern slopes between Pommard and Volnay, while Frémiers (0.79ha) lies to the south of Pommard just below Rugiens. Croix Noires (0.58ha) is also located below Rugiens, adjacent to Frémiers on the north side and the domaine owns more than half the total area of this appellation. Vaumuriens is sourced from 1.44ha located just above Rugiens and Bourgogne Pinot Noir lies adjacent to the Pommard appellation.

Domaine du Pavillon (O)

This fine estate, consisting of 19.5ha in Pommard, is entirely owned by the highly regarded Maison Albert Bichot. Respectful of the environment and diligent in both the vineyard and the cellar, the domaine produces a range of impressive wines that punch well above their weight, including the delicious Beaune Blanc 1^{er} Cru 'Clos des Mouches', the beautifully creamy textured yet finely poised Meursault 1^{er} Cu 'Les Charmes' and a powerful, tightly wound and complex Corton Charlemagne Grand Cru. As for the reds, three crus stand out – namely the amply expressive Volnay 1^{er} Cru 'Les Santenots', the fine, richly expressive and intense Pommard 1^{er} Cru 'Les Rugiens' and the complex, deeply aromatic and broad-shouldered Corton Rouge Grand Cru 'Clos des Maréchaudes'. Included within the estate's 19.5ha are nearly four hectares of *monopole* vineyard – Pommard 'Clos des Ursulines'. As at Domaine du Clos Frantin in Nuits-Saint-Georges, the estate practices organic viticulture with ongoing respect for the complex balances found in nature, and has been Certified Organic since 2018. The winery was modernised in 2016, permitting vinification of more of the Côte de Beaune's single vineyards in vats of varying sizes and thereby making the most of the single vineyard approach.

Tucked away in the village of Pernand Vergelesses at the northern end of the Côte de Beaune, behind the hill of Corton, Vincent Rapet is producing consistently high-quality Burgundy. This long-established, family-run 20ha domaine fashions wines that are contemporary yet authentic expressions of their origins. Vincent is a young talent who, alongside his wife Sylvette, brings more attention to the appellation. Among their white wines we feature here the focused, refined Pernand Vergelesses Blanc 'Les Combottes' and the superbly built, tightly wound Corton Charlemagne Grand Cru. Their one red wine is the svelte, beautifully balanced Pernand Vergelesses Rouge 1^{er} Cru 'Les Vergelesses'.

CÔTE DE NUITS

Domaine Henri Gouges/Maison Gouges (O)

Gouges is a family that oscillates between tradition on the one hand and a vision of the future on the other. In 1940, Marcel and Michel Gouges replanted their old vineyards to ensure the estate's future. The present vines are around 50 years old and are cultivated organically by Pierre and Christian Gouges, who have also modernised the estate's vinification techniques and were the first to adopt sustainable viticulture. Located in Nuits Saint Georges in the heart of the Côte d'Or, the present estate extends over nearly 14 ha that includes 10 parcels of AOC. Among these appellations are 7 Premiers Crus (1 white, 6 red) and a family Monopole – the 'Clos des Porrets Saint Georges'. Production volumes are related to the climatic conditions each season, with growing methods focusing on quality and respect for terroir rather than quantity. Winemaking is by extraction through infusion, followed by a light pressing and sedimentation in tuns. The results are then aged in oak barrels for 10-18 months, using 10-30% new wood, to create soft, silky wines that retain a distinctive stamina as well as a capacity for much longer ageing.

Domaine Jean Chauvenet

A classic Burgundian family-run holding, within a stone's throw of Vosne-Romanée, that produces some of the most elegant and stylish wines in Nuits-Saint-Georges. Jean Chauvenet spent many years extending his holdings to 10ha, including no fewer than five Nuits-Saint-Georges Premier Crus. The domaine is now run by Jean's son-in-law, Christophe Drag, and his wife Christine, who are working tirelessly towards organic certification. Having studied at Lycée Viticole in Beaune and the University of Dijon, Christophe has brought a modern, energetic touch to the domaine and distinguishes between the north and south 1^{er} Crus – those to north being more delicate, while those to the south possess more structure. His village holdings in Nuits-St-Georges and Vosne-Romanée are also well worth a look, with 'Les Vaucrains' among the finest examples.

Domaine Chevillon

With a history of growing vines for four generations in the heart of Nuits St Georges, Domain Chevillon has been steadily building its reputation since the 1900s. Hailed today as one of the leading growers in the region, its wines stand shoulder to shoulder with the very best in Burgundy. In 1990 brothers Denis and Bertrand Chevillon, together with their father Robert (who retired in 2003), joined forces to spearhead the development of the domaine, combining deeply rooted tradition with modern methods to create wines designed to be kept. Today the domaine covers 13ha, mostly red Premier Crus (8) that boast an enviable depth of quality. Meticulous craftsmanship is applied in both the vineyards and the cellars. The vineyards are run according to *lutte raisonnée*, the grapes being 100% destalked and then left to undergo a cool pre-maceration before a 3 to 5 week fermentation in vats. On average the wines spend 18 months in barrel, with up to 30% new oak for the Premier Crus. The results are superb, exhibiting an attractive and lively fruit-forward character while revealing distinctive facets of their terroir combined with a wonderful finesse, complexity and distinct pedigree.

Château-Gris (O)

The castle of Château Gris was built in the 18th century in the middle of a 3.5ha walled vineyard. After the vines were later destroyed by phylloxera, the castle roof was covered with grey slate (instead of the clay tiles more commonly used in Burgundy), causing it to become known as 'Château Gris' ('grey castle'). Following a court ruling in the 1920s, this name was allowed to prevail over previous lieu-dit of 'Les Crots'. The vines are planted on terraced slopes that reach an altitude of 280 m. The plots of land at the foot of the castle produce Nuits-St-Georges 1^{er} Cru 'Château Gris' red, while those at higher up are planted with Chardonnay that yields the white Nuits-St-Georges 'Les Terrasses'.

Domaine du Clos Frantin (O)

Wholly owned by the respected family-run Burgundian Maison Albert Bichot, this fine single estate is located in Nuits-St-Georges and comprises of 13ha of prime Côte de Nuits holdings, of which 8ha are 1^{er} and Grand Cru vineyards. Respect for the soils, rigorous pruning and green harvesting all help to ensure the final quality of fruit. Vinification and maturation are carried out gently and respectfully, modifying the techniques to complement the fruit style of each vintage.

Maison Albert Bichot

With a history stretching back eight centuries, the Bichot family has deep roots in the region, as well as some of the finest crus in its portfolio. The first records of the Bichot family date back to 1214 and in 1350 they settled in Burgundy, specifically the fief of Châteauneuf-en-Auxois. Now headed by Albéric Bichot, the sixth generation of the present family, Bichot has gone from strength to strength with quality and authenticity as its watchwords. As well as drawing on 100ha of their own vineyards, including Domaine Long-Depaquit in Chablis, Domaine du Pavillon in Pommard and Domaine Clos du Frantin in Nuits-St-Georges, Bichot also vinify wines from a further 50ha in their capacity as a *négociant*. Extreme diligence is practised throughout, whether in the vineyards under the stewardship of Christophe Cavel or in the cellars under the eye of Alain Serveau, thereby ensuring that quality remains up there with that of Burgundy's finest producers. The challenges, though, remain numerous, converting to organic viticulture, adapting to new markets, and increasing the profile of Burgundy wines being just three. Each new vintage also presents the challenge of expressing the nature of the various individual terroirs while maintaining respect for nature. It's this understanding of the complex equilibriums at play that lends Bichot wines their elegance and authenticity, reflected in a growing number of well deserved international awards.

Domaine Confuron-Cotetidot

One of the most serious and consistent domaines in the Côte d'Or, Domaine Confuron-Cotetidot is especially noted for its superb village wines. Vignerons since the 17th century, the Confuron family know exactly how far they can push their established old vines, regardless of whatever climatic changes they encounter, and rely on vine health to produce wines of the highest quality. Their 12ha of vineyards are worked organically, ploughed manually, and have never seen chemical treatments. Today, the domaine is overseen by Yves Confuron, who also looks after Domaine de Courcel. Laconic yet highly opinionated, he is a passionate advocate of traditional Burgundian winemaking techniques; he ages his wines for far longer than most and is quick to dismiss those making 'pale' wines. Yves is also among the last in the region to pick, insisting on riper stems for traditional whole-bunch vinification. Traditional in every sense the word, his wines display genuine pedigree with an undeniable expression of terroir that echoes the true Burgundian soul; seriously built, yet seductive, they are made to last and should age very well in the longer term. Those who apply patience, time and understanding will be well rewarded from cellaring these wines.

Domaine Georges Lignier, Côte de Nuits

With an extraordinary terroir covering 16ha split between 50 different plots, Domaine Georges Lignier et Fils cultivates 17 appellations including four top Grand Crus. At 1.5ha, they are the largest owner of Clos Saint-Denis and control over a hectare of Clos de la Roche. Benoît Stehly, nephew of Georges Lignier, has run the estate since 2003, having worked at the domaine for a decade alongside his uncle. His approach is one of delicacy while seeking maximum aromatic concentration and quality has improved dramatically as a result. The average age of the vines is 50 years and there hasn't been any major replanting for more than 15 years, resulting in vineyards where production is regulated by means of low yields. Around 70-90% of the fruit is destemmed, with the wine directly transferred to 228 litre oak barrels post-fermentation and left to mature for a period of 18-20 months. At the 'Villages' level the wines are matured in used oak barrels (sourced from Vosges, Allier and Nivers forests), while the 1er Crus see 25-30% new oak and the Grand Crus 50% new oak. Benoît's deep respect for tradition and expression of terroir ensures that his wines evoke their precise origins with clarity and poise.

Domaine des Lambrays

This famous 11ha domaine owns the largest single holding of any Grand Cru vineyard in Burgundy – 8.7ha of Clos des Lambrays. With a history stretching back to the mid-19th century, it was previously in the hands of the Freund family (originally from Koblenz in Germany) but in April 2014 was purchased by LVMH. Responsibility for winemaking and general management passed from Boris Champy to the gentle and hospitable Thierry Brouin, who had been *in situ* since 1979 (39 vintages!) and to whom much of the credit must go for the excellent quality of the wines from the re-emerged estate. Jacques Desvauges took over the mantle in 2019, marking the start of a conversion to organic and biodynamic viticulture. The Grand Cru will age superbly, while the Morey St Denis AC is an expressive blend of fruit from two renowned *lieux-dits* – ‘Les Larreys’ (just above the Grand Cru Clos des Lambrays itself) and ‘En La Rue de Vergey’ (just above the Grand Cru Clos de Tart). Jacques strives for purity and precision.

Domaine Rossignol-Trapet (B)

Comprising 14ha, Domaine Rossignol-Trapet was created in 1990 when the original Louis Trapet vineyard holdings were divided between Louis’s daughter and his son-in-law, Jacques Rossignol. Since then, Jacques’ two sons, Nicolas and David, have gradually taken over the reins of the business. The Domaine has been Certified 100% Biodynamic since 2004. With vineyards spread equally across Village, 1^{er} and Grand Cru holdings in Gevrey-Chambertin, it offers a fascinating insight into the sheer variety of flavours that this famous Burgundy village can muster. The quality of the beautifully manicured tannins is superb. Up to 50% whole bunch harvesting and gentle extraction have made left their mark on the superb finesse of the wines. The brothers prefer to harvest later and use less new oak, aiming to achieve ‘fruit sweetness rather than oak sweetness.’ Typically, the ‘Village’ wine matures in 10-15% new oak, the 1^{er} Crus in 25% new oak and the Grands Crus in 50% new oak. As elsewhere, though, volumes have been significantly reduced.

Domaine Marc Roy

Located in the heart of Gevrey-Chambertin, and passed from father to son for generations, today the winemaking at Domaine Marc Roy is in the capable hands of Marc's only daughter, Alexandrine Roy. The fourth generation of the family to make wine in Gevrey-Chambertin, she won her spurs in the classic Pinot growing regions of Oregon and Central Otago, New Zealand before taking over from her father in 2003. Alexandrine works the domaine's 3.5ha in Gevrey-Chambertin and 0.5ha in Marsannay almost single-handedly, with only two other full time staff. All of the holdings are classified at 'village' level, yet the wines far exceed expectations, with many exhibiting 1^{er} Cru or even Grand Cru status – a testament to her artistry. Alexandrine's meticulous hard work and acute attention to detail in the vineyards recalls that of the bonsai grower, each vine (many of which are over a century old) receiving the same level of individual attention. Naturally low-yielding, they are carefully managed to produce the finest fruit possible. The grapes are 100% destemmed and rely on indigenous yeasts for fermentation. Extraction is gentle and often includes foot treading where required. The oak regime is similarly subtle, purity and elegance being prioritised over raw power. The barrels are sourced from a single cooper (Cadus) using a hard, compact oak from the forest of Nevers with a medium toast. Elevage takes place over 11 months using a mix of 50% new to 50% one-year old barrels. Seldom do wines reach the pristine heights of Alexandrine's – a pure expression of ancient vines that are elegant, silky, supple and plush; a pleasure to drink!

Domaine Tortochot (O)

Domaine Tortochot is one of the more famous estates in the Côte de Nuits, currently run by fourth generation Chantal Tortochot, who took over from her father in the late 1990s. The estate is blessed with 12ha of vines spread over 34 separate parcels, including some of the most enviable sites in Burgundy – plots in the Grands Crus of Chambertin (the most northerly section of the vineyard), Mazis-Chambertin and Charmes-Chambertin, as well some beautifully positioned 1^{er} Cru that include rows of vines in the 1^{er} Cru ‘Lavaux Saint-Jacques’ bordering the famous ‘Clos Saint-Jacques’. After a move towards organic viticulture in 2003, Chantal made all the vineyards wholly organic in 2008. Gevrey Chambertin ‘Les Corvées’ is her experimental vineyard, where she tries out net cultivation and non-chemical treatments that leave the soil as natural as possible. Chantal makes traditional style Gevrey – lots of chiselled fruit and structured tannins with bright acidity. The grapes are 100% destemmed, and fermentation temperatures are carefully supervised before the wines are transferred to medium-toasted barrels for cellaring – 100% new oak for the Grands Crus, 50% for the 1^{er} Cru, 25% for the ‘village’ wines – with malolactic fermentation taking place over the 15-18 month ageing period. The estate boasts 4 Grand Crus: three in Gevrey – Charmes, Chambertin and the flagship Grand Cru – plus the excellent Mazis Chambertin. The estate also has a modest seven rows of vines in the Clos de Vougeot Grand Cru vineyard.

Wines that are ordered in full cases will be delivered in their original packaging unless stated otherwise. If any original case packaging within the warehouse becomes damaged during handling or throughout its storage, then these stocks will be re-packed into 're-used' boxes.
